



# Bio-Security Protocol Against COVID-19

In the midst of these unprecedented times we are all facing because of the Corona Virus (COVID-19), for the sixth year in a row the SCORE World Desert Championship is being held in its entirety in Baja California, a place where off road racing is part of its history.

Like many other places in the U.S. and in the world, Baja California has experienced various challenges because of the COVID-19 situation and therefore is applying strict Bio-security Protocols in the reopening of Hotels, Restaurants and other services.

When participating in the upcoming SCORE Baja 1000 please be reminded that you are a guest of the people and governments of Baja California and Ensenada who not only welcome you but at the same time urge you to follow at all times important health measures such as wearing a facemask, maintaining safe distance from other persons and constantly sanitizing your hands.

At SCORE International the health and safety of our racers, sponsors, fans, staff and citizens of Baja California are our highest priority.

## COVID-19 RECOMMENDATIONS WHEN VISITING BAJA CALIFORNIA

1. Wear a face mask by covering your mouth and nose at all times and a face shield when exposed for extended periods of time to others. It is recommended to bring your own face masks and shields.
2. Practice Social Distancing by always maintaining a minimum distance of 4.5 to 6 ft. (1.5 to 2.0 meters).
3. Use hand sanitizer and a sanitizing mat when offered at the entrance to a restaurant, hotel, store or any other venue.
4. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer especially if you use a rest room or touch common surfaces, exchange money, receipts, keys, credit cards, badges, etc. It is recommended that you carry with you a small bottle of hand sanitizer.
5. It is important to remember that before removing your face mask and/or face shield you must thoroughly wash your hands with soap and water or disinfect with hand sanitizer and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
6. Avoid contact with groups larger than 10 persons as they all must wear a face mask and maintain social distancing even among groups of friends and associates.
7. Whenever waiting in line at the entrance of a restaurant, hotel, and store for example ensure you are wearing your face mask properly and are practicing social distancing.
8. As COVID-19 is a highly contagious respiratory virus authorities recommend that attendees to any area with a crowd must always correctly wear a face mask, practice social distancing, and avoid handshakes and hugging.

## COVID-19 RECOMMENDATIONS - *continued*

9. Avoid sharing cups, plates, spoons and other items and in general anything that has not been properly sanitized.
10. Health Authorities recommend that a combined use of face mask and/or face shield increase the security of persons in places where dust, sand fragments and smoke is created
11. If you camp or set-up around the race course do not forget to pick up your trash and dispose of all materials such as face masks, shields, gloves, etc. in a separate bag and spraying them with disinfectant.
12. According to Health Authorities any person that has respiratory symptoms, a cough, sore throat, headache, and fever, loss of smell or taste and general discomfort should not come to the race. If any person already at the race develops any of these symptoms, they should self-isolate and permanently use a face mask and face shield until receiving medical attention.
