



Rules For The Baja 1000

Controlled Access

Areas

Updated 10.29.20

The SCORE Baja 1000 is a 100% restricted access event with a limited number of team members allowed and no spectators. Restricted areas are Registration, Chassis Inspections and Stella III EVO area, Tech/Contingency, Staging Area, Start, Finish, Finish Interview Area, Media Areas, Results Review, and Awards pickup.

Due to the COVID-19 all race activities will be conducted under the strict health guidelines of a government approved Bio-Security Protocol. The use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and social distancing will be required at all times.

All persons eligible for access to restricted areas must register with SCORE, sign waivers, and receive SCORE wristbands to access event areas. It is the responsibility of each team member to read, understand, and follow all requirements. Failure to sign waivers, be banded, and follow health protocols will result in persons being removed from the restricted areas.

In addition to the Drivers of Record, Riders of Record, Co-Drivers, Co-Riders, and Navigators each team can request wristbands for up to four (4) essential team persons. The definition of an essential team person is someone absolutely necessary to service or repair the race vehicle or extremely important to the operation of the race team. No essential team person can be under the age of 16. All essential team persons must have a picture ID with them at all times as the name on their wristband will be checked against the ID at each entrance.

Live streaming and Weatherman feed will be available on the SCORE website.

Wristbands, face masks or helmets must be worn at all times while in the SCORE designed areas starting on Tuesday Noon through Sunday at 2 PM. Non-compliance will result in team penalties up to and including disqualification.

Registration Access

The on-site registration area is limited to persons entering the race as a participant and up to four (4) essential team persons. All must sign waivers and obtain a race weekend wristband. No one under 16 will be allowed in the on-site registration area unless they are registering to race.

All Drivers of Record, Riders of Record, Co-drivers, Co-Riders, and Navigators not submitting a notarized waiver by the October 30th deadline, **MUST** appear in person to complete registration requirements. DO NOT go to Tech/Contingency until all members of your team have gone to on-site registration

Essential team persons do not have to attend on-site registration if you print the *Controlled Access Area* waiver form from the SCORE website and have up to four (4) persons sign this form. Bring these signed Controlled Access waiver forms to on-site registration. <http://score-international.com/raceinfo/2020-controlled-access-waiver/> All signatures **must be original**; you cannot have one person complete and sign for others. When you present the waiver form(s) at on-site Registration, if any signature appears not to be original, you will not receive a wristband for that person.

Controlled Access waiver forms are also available for pickup in the SCORE Ensenada office.

All participants and essential team persons must sign waivers and be banded by Thursday, November 19th at 4:00pm to be eligible to compete or for access to restricted areas.

Team Vehicle Parking Passes

Each registered race team will receive two (2) vehicle parking passes when you go to on-site registration. One must be placed on the race vehicle including motorcycles and Quads. The other pass is for use on a chase or personal vehicle (including UTV's) and placed on the lower left front windshield area.

Chassis Inspections, Stella III EVO assembly purchases, and access to Installation Area

These activities will be in a restricted area requiring masks but do not require wristbands. No one under 16 years of age will be allowed.

Tech/Contingency Access

Only banded race participants and banded essential team members will be permitted in the area on Wednesday and Thursday. **No** spectators and persons under 16 will be allowed unless registered to race. You must go to on-site registration prior to placing your vehicle at the entrance to Tech/Contingency. The top 10 Trophy Truck in points who have completed registration will start the line on Thursday at 9AM.

Baja 1000 Staging/Start Area

All race vehicles must enter the area under their own power, no trailers allowed, and starting Driver/Co-Drivers (Navigators), Rider, Co-Riders must be in or on the vehicle. Only the race vehicle and one (1) chase/personal vehicle with a SCORE team parking sticker will be permitted entry into the staging area. However, once the vehicle enters the restricted start area only the participants starting the race will be allowed.

Race Participants in or on Vehicles Finishing the Race

When helmet is removed a mask must immediately be worn. Make sure you have a mask with you.

When your vehicle finishes the race and comes down off the finish interview ramp, stop but **DO NOT EXIT** the vehicle. You will be handed the team finisher medals. If you are the first official finisher, you will receive your Champagne and flag. **(Because of COVID-19 restrictions, you will not be permitted to open the Champagne in the finish or interview areas.)** Immediately move forward to the photo/interview area. There will be a brief time allotted for interviews. When your interview is complete or a SCORE staff member directs you to leave the area, exit immediately and meet up with your team after leaving the property.

Baja 1000 Finish Area Access for Persons Not Finishing in or on a Vehicle

Due to COVID-19 Bio-Security restrictions, each team will receive (1) wristband in their driver packet for access to the finish interview area. This wristband will allow ONE (1) BANDED DOR/ROR, Co-Driver/Co-Rider, Navigator or One Banded Essential Team Person to meet your team in the finish interview area after the ramp. The wristband does not allow finish ramp access.

Each team will select the team member who may go to the finish interview area. The band is temporary and must be worn along with another wristband issued by registration. When your team leaves the finish interview area, you must also leave.

For example: The DOR is not in the vehicle at the finish line but wants to meet the team in the finish interview area, they would be required to be wearing both their participant band and the additional wristband. No one with just a single band will be allowed into the area.

If you lose or damage the wristband, it CANNOT be replaced! There will be **NO WRISTBANDS AVAILABLE AT ENTRANCE TO POST-INTERVIEW AREA.**

SCORE Team Media Credentials

SCORE Team Media Credential request applications are now available online (under SCORE Media tab on the SCORE Website) and will be open until 8 p.m. on Friday, November 6th. There will be no on-site SCORE Team Media credential requests accepted, only preregistered individuals will be allowed into the on-site Media Registration area. Because of the health and safety protocols, access to designated media areas at the start and finish will be limited.

Review Results With Race Director

Only the Driver of Record/Rider of Record plus one other banded team member will be granted access to the results review area.

Awards

Trophy pick-up will be at the Lucerna Hotel; only the Driver/Rider of Record or one person representing the team may enter the area to pick up the award. All other individuals must remain outside.
